1 Robert Burns Birthplace Museum

> Explore the life of one of Scotland's most famous literary figures, Robert Burns.

2 Dumfries House

Set in 2000 acres, this stunning estate and 18th Century House with its unrivalled collection of original furniture has something for everyone.

3 Culzean Castle

Panoramic views over the Firth of Clyde, with woodland, formal gardens and coastline to explore.

4 Kelburn Castle and Country Park

A 13th century castle with exotic gardens, Secret Forest and falconry centre.

5 Star gazing

Publicly accessible observatory in the world renowned Galloway Forest Dark Sky Park.

6 RSPB Lochwinnoch

Visit RSPB Lochwinnoch, one of the few wetlands left in West Scotland – a great day out for all ages.

7 Heads of Ayr Farm Park

Fun park with bumper boats, electric tractors, trampolines, quad biking, various animals and more.

8 Local routes

There are several walks to enjoy from the sites and in the local area.


9 Ayrshire Coastal Path

Stretching for 148km along the coastline, much of this route runs along sandy beaches. Head south from Ayr to see Greenan Castle.

10 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to the site is 7, Carlisle to Glasgow, Lochs and Glens South. You can cycle to Troon on this route.

11 Isle of Arran


Discover the history, wildlife, and landscapes of this small island.


12 Ayr

-Visitor's top tips

The best fish & chips are at Troon Harbour, the Wee Hurrie – try the salmon, homemade fish cakes or even Lobster!

Visit the Tam O Shanter for good food, and of course connections to the famous Robbie Burns.

Easy walk along the river into Ayr town centre.

Take a drive down the stunning coast road A719 to Dunure, quaint 19th century harbour and castle ruins.

Ayr beach is walking distance, or a short drive away, and is great for the dogs.

Dumfries House and the gardens were very interesting.

Plenty of history in the town. Follow the walk and there are information plaques to tell all.

Culzean Castle (National Trust) is a must! It's a great day out.
