



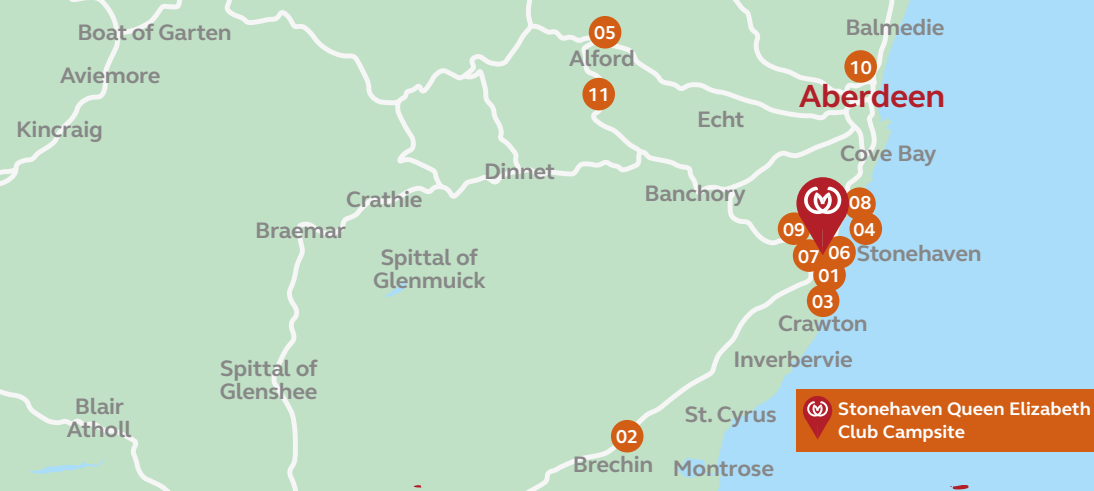

## Visit

- 1** **Dunnottar Castle**  
Spectacular ruin towering 160ft above the North Sea. Steeped in history and a photographer's paradise.
- 2** **Caledonian Railway**  
Journey through beautiful countryside, one of the most visited tourist attractions in Angus.
- 3** **Fowlsheugh RSPB Reserve**  
One of the largest seabird colonies on mainland Britain, with around 130,000 birds.
- 4** **Sea Safari**  
Witness dramatic coastal scenery and incredible wildlife, including dolphins and puffins, as you venture out on a breath-taking and exhilarating sea safari boat tour.

- 5** **Grampian Transport Museum**  
An impressive range of transport exhibits through the ages.
- 6** **Stand up Paddleboarding**  
Paddle below the iconic Dunnottar Castle, explore majestic caves and coves, and look out for wildlife on a fun paddleboarding excursion.

### 7 Scot Free Walking Tours

Discover the stories behind the landmarks – featuring tales of religious discord, the Titanic and birth of the deep fried Mars bar.

### 8 Local Routes

The coast path is outside the site entrance and there are scenic beach walks to the cliffs of Dunnottar Castle.

### 9 Local Routes

The nearest National Cycle Network route is Coast and Castles North (Edinburgh to Aberdeen) – Route 1 and there are numerous routes to follow in the local countryside.

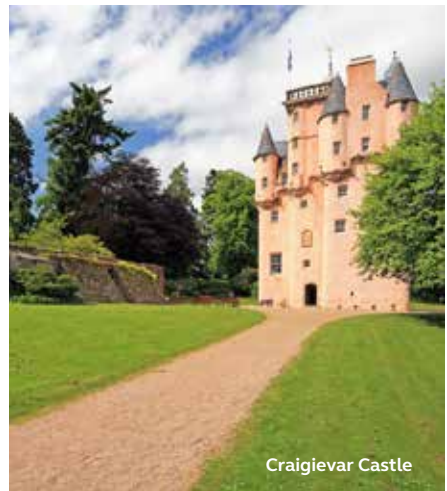
## Explore

### 10 Aberdeen

Famous for its stunning, sparkling, granite buildings, a place where the harbour meets the city centre. Spot the resident pod of dolphins playing in the waters, enjoy a beach stroll or do some shopping.

### 11 Craigievar Castle

Nestled on a picturesque hillside, the enchanting pink tower of Craigievar Castle is breathtaking.





## Visitor's top tips

Enjoy Stonehaven's 50m long pool and lido full of cleaned sea water and maintained at 29°C.

The beach is great, especially early in the morning when there's a variety of water birds to see – we also saw seals!

Go to Aunty Betty's ice cream shop, it is amazing.

St Cyrus beach is a must.


Rods and boats for sea fishing can be hired at the harbour.

The Carron fish and chip shop serves the best fish supper we've had.

Peterhead prison is fascinating.

There are good bus services to Aberdeen so definitely go and visit if you have the time. The maritime museum and art galleries in Aberdeen are good.

Dunnotar castle is well worth a visit. We walked from the site, route is well signposted from the harbour. Take a picnic and enjoy the views.

A well-located site to explore Aberdeenshire. Stonehaven is nice to walk around with independent shops, historic attractions and a harbour. 

## Close by

### Supermarkets

There is a Co-op and Spar in Stonehaven and Asda at Portlethen, 10 miles.

### Petrol Station

BP is 0.9 miles away or Co-op petrol station is 2.5 miles from site.

### Swimming pool

Heated open air and indoor pools are next door.

### Tourist Information

Visit Scotland Information Centre, Stonehaven.

### Cashpoint

RBS 0.6 miles, TSB 0.7 miles.

### Public transport

The town's railway station is 1 mile away and is part of the mainline link to Edinburgh, Aberdeen and beyond. There are also good bus routes to these cities.
